Violence against American Indian/Alaska Native Women

Compared to all other races, they are...

2.5x as likely to experience violent crimes

2x more likely to experience rape or sexual assault crimes


1.5 million women

Only Alerting Authorities can use Event Codes



The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) establishes new Event Codes and maintains the list of approved Event Codes.


State, Tribal, local, and territorial Alerting Authorities use IPAWS to issue non-weather Event Codes for emergencies.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) issues weather alerts.


- -The Office of Native Affairs and Policy (ONAP) is directed to coordinate government-to-government consultation with Tribal Nations.
- -Announcement of commencement will be via public notice at a later date.




