This statewide Native American Community and Economic Development Planning Summit will be held on the main campus of the University of Nevada, Reno on Monday, February 14, 2022 and Tuesday, February 15, 2022 at the Joe Crowley Student Union. Representatives from Nevada's various Native American communities and Tribal Councils will come together with federal, state, and local government representatives from across Nevada for the purpose of developing a statewide Native American comprehensive community and economic development plan.

The goal of this Summit is to develop actionable items and identify potential programs and projects in nine community and economic development categories, including:

Organizational Administrative Capacity Building, Healthcare Services, Education and Workforce Development, Infrastructure, Business Development, Cultural Preservation and Development, Elder and Youth Services, Housing, and Natural Resource Management

The results of this Summit will be compiled into a statewide Native American Community and Economic Development Plan in order to facilitate local community grant applications for the U.S. Economic Development Administration's *Indigenous Communities* program, part of the 2021 American Rescue Plan.
